The Commission invites applications from suitable candidates to fill the following vacancy in the Co-operative Tribunal.

Job Purpose:

To arbitrate Tribunal matters as stipulated in the Sugar Act 25 No. 11 of 2024.

Reporting Responsibilities

The job holder is responsible to the Hon. Chairperson of the Tribunal.

Area of Deployment:

The successful candidates will be posted in the designated office of the Tribunal.

Job Requirements: Academic and Professional Qualifications:

For appointment to the position of **Member**, **Sugar Arbitration Tribunal**, a candidate must meet the following minimum requirements;

- a) Relevant Degree Certificate from a recognized university;
- b) Have expert knowledge in economics, trade, law, agriculture, research and engineering; with at least five years' experience in arbitration;
- c) Be a member of a relevant professional body and in good standing; and
- d) Be of high moral character, integrity and impartiality, in line with Chapter Six (6) of the Constitution.
- e) Should not be a Public Servant or take active part in the activities of a Political Party.

Job Core Competencies:

- i. Professional Competence;
- ii. Excellent Administrative and Management Skills;
- iii. Excellent Communication skills
- iv. Good Temperament and Interpersonal skills
- v. Good Judgmental Skills; and
- vi. Commitment to Public and Community Life

- (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment on the applicant's past and present employment;
- (c) Names of three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment about the applicant's past and present employment or engagement;
- (d) Copies of Testimonials, National ID/ passport, professional certificates, and academic transcripts
- (e) Current practicing certificate (where applicable).
- (f) Applicant's recent colored passport-size photograph and
- (g) **Five (5) sample writings** which may include but not limited to scholarly writings or any professional publications that the applicant has authored.

 - Directorate of Criminal Investigation,
 - Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission,
 - a recognized Credit Reference Bureau, and
 - Certificate of Good Standing from Law Society of Kenya.
 - Clearance from relevant professional body.

- 5. Shortlisted candidates shall be required to produce originals of their National Identity card, academic and professional certificates and transcripts, Certificate of Admission to roll of advocate during interview.
- 6. The Commission will verify certificates submitted with respective institutions. It is observed that it is a criminal offense to present fake documents or false information
