The Commission therefore invites applications from suitable candidates to fill the position of **Member, Financial Centre Tribunal**.

Job Requirements: Academic and Professional Qualifications:

For appointment to the position of **Member Financial Centre Tribunal**, an applicant must be in possession of the qualifications provided under **Section 35 of the Nairobi International Financial Centre Act, 2017**.

- i. Hold a Bachelor of Laws degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
- ii. Be an advocate of the High Court of Kenya;
- iii. Seven (7) years' experience in the financial services sector.
- iv. Be of good character.
- v. Be a member of a relevant professional body in good standing;
- vi. Meet the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity.

- ii. Excellent Conceptual & Analytical Skills
- iii. Interpersonal Skills

Terms of Service

Under **Section 35 (3) of the Nairobi International Financial Centre Act (Cap. 495)**, the term of service for the Member shall be appointed for a term of three years renewable for one further term of three years.

Remuneration:

Under **Section 35 (6) of the Nairobi International Financial Centre Act (Cap. 495)** the remuneration and allowances of the Members of the Financial Centre Tribunal shall be determined by the Judicial Service Commission in consultation with the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.

HOW TO APPLY

1. Interested and qualified persons are requested to make their applications by filling out an **Online Application** for Employment Form available at the JSC jobs portal: <https://jsc.go.ke/jobs-2/>. Applicants should upload soft copies of the following documents to the online application: -
 - (a) A letter of application.
 - (b) A detailed and updated curriculum vitae to include background information such as community service, financial discipline, pro bono activity (if any), involvement as a party in litigation, and involvement in political activity, including financial contribution to political party parties (if any) and criminal record, professional engagement, three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment on the applicant's past and present employment;
 - (c) Names of three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment about the applicant's past and present employment or engagement;
 - (d) Copy of professional certificates, testimonials, and academic transcripts, certificate of Admission to roll of advocate (where applicable)
 - (e) Applicant's recent colored passport-size photograph and

- (f) **Five (5) sample** writings of any professional writings, including but not limited to judgments, advocacy submissions in courts, scholarly writings or any professional publications that the applicant has authored.
