The Judicial Service Commission (JSC) is a corporate body established under **Article 171 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010**, with the mandate of promoting and facilitating the independence and accountability of the Judiciary and the efficient, effective, and transparent administration of justice.

The Commission invites applications from suitable candidates to fill the position of **Member of the Capital Markets Tribunal**.

MEMBER, CAPITAL MARKETS TRIBUNAL, NON-ADVOCATE (2 POSTS)

Pursuant to **Section 35A (1)(c) & (d) of the Capital Markets Act (Cap. 485A)**, an applicant to be appointed as Member, Capital Markets Tribunal must possess the following qualifications.

- i. Bachelor's degree in commerce (Accounting/Finance option), Business Administration Accounting/Finance option), Economics, or any other recognized equivalent qualification from a recognized institution;
- ii. Have at least **seven (7) years** of relevant experience.
- iii. Has demonstrated competence in the field of security.
- iv. Qualification and experience in alternative dispute resolution will be an added advantage;
- v. Have a high moral character, integrity, and impartiality (meet the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity).

Job Core Competencies:

- i. High degree of professional competence
- ii. Good oral & written communication skills

- iii. Good temperament
- iv. Good judgement in both legal and life experience
- v. Commitment to public and community service

Tenure of Office

Section 35A (3) (a) of the Capital Markets Act provides that the office of a member of the Tribunal shall become vacant at the expiration of three (3) years from the date of his/her appointment.

Remuneration:

Section 35A (25) of the Capital Markets provides that the Chairperson, secretary and the members of the Tribunal, shall be paid such remuneration and allowances at rates determined by the Judicial Service Commission in consultation with the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.

HOW TO APPLY

Interested and qualified persons are requested to make their applications by filling out an **Online Application** for Employment Form available at the JSC jobs portal: **<https://jsc.go.ke/jobs-2/>**. Applicants should upload soft copies of the following documents to the online application: -

- (a) A letter of application.
- (b) A detailed and updated curriculum vitae, to include background information such as community service, financial discipline, pro bono activity (if any), involvement as a party in litigation and involvement in political activity including financial contribution to political party parties (if any) and criminal record, professional engagement, three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment on the applicant's past and present employment;
- (c) Names of three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment about the applicant's past and present employment or engagement;
- (d) professional certificates, testimonials, and academic transcripts, Certificate of Admission to the roll of advocate (where applicable)
- (e) Applicant's recent colored passport-size photograph and

- (f) **Five (5) sample** writings of any professional writings, including but not limited to judgments, advocacy submissions in courts, scholarly writings or any professional publications that the applicant has authored.

The applications must reach the Commission **NOT LATER THAN 13TH AUGUST 2026 AT 5.00 P.M.**
