The Judicial Service Commission (JSC) is a corporate body established under **Article 171 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010**, with the mandate of promoting and facilitating the independence and accountability of the Judiciary and the efficient, effective, and transparent administration of justice.

The Commission invites applications from suitable candidates to fill the position of **Member HIV and AIDS Tribunal**.

1. MEMBER HIV AND AIDS TRIBUNAL ONE (1) POST

Job Requirements: Academic and Professional Qualifications:

Under **Section 25 (1)(c) of the HIV AND AIDS Prevention and Control Act No. 14 of 2006**, applicants for the position of Member, of the HIV AND AIDS Tribunal – Medical Practitioner must have the following minimum requirements:

- i. A Bachelor of Medicine and surgery or Bachelor of dental medicine and surgery or its equivalent from a university recognized in Kenya.
- ii. Post graduate training programme in a particular field of medicine or dentistry, as specialists under the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Act (Cap. 253);
- iii. Has gained sufficient experience and demonstrated to the Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentists Council satisfaction adequate knowledge and skill in his chosen field;
- iv. Meet the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity.

Job Core Competencies:

- i. High degree of professional competence
- ii. Good oral & written communication skills
- iii. Good temperament
- iv. Good judgement in both legal and life experience
- v. Commitment to public and community service

Terms of Service

Under Section 25 (6) (a) of the HIV and AIDS Prevention and Control (2006), the terms of service for the Members of HIV and AIDS Tribunal shall be three (3) years from the date of the appointment.

Remuneration:

The remuneration and allowances of the Members of the HIV and AIDS Tribunal shall be paid at rates determined by the Judicial Service Commission in consultation with the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.

- (a) A letter of application.
- (b) A detailed and updated curriculum vitae, to include background information such as community service, financial discipline, pro bono activity (if any), involvement as a party in litigation and involvement in political activity including financial contribution to political party parties (if any) and criminal record, professional engagement, three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment on the applicant's past and present employment;
- (c) Names of three (3) professional references and two (2) character references who can verify and comment about the applicant's past and present employment or engagement;
- (d) professional certificates, testimonials, and academic transcripts, Certificate of Admission to roll of advocate (where applicable)

- (e) Applicant's recent colored passport-size photograph and
- (f) **Five (5) sample** writings of any professional writings, including but not limited to judgments, advocacy submissions in courts, scholarly writings or any professional publications that the applicant has authored.
